Amendment B

Effective 1 November 2010, the following changes will be made to the Procurement Quality Requirements (PQR) document. All other provisions of the PQR as defined by Revision 3 and Amendment A, except those explicitly denoted below, remain unchanged and in full effect.

Page 12-13, Paragraph 17

REVISED:

17. BAE SYSTEMS MARKING REQUIREMENTS

Marking shall be permanent, clear, legible, and formatted as follows:

A. If marking requirements are defined on the drawing:

- 1. Mark parts per the drawing
 - a. Add part number suffixes per the PO line
 - b. If the marking note on the drawing states "NOTE- THE MFR CAGE CODE SHALL BE THAT OF THE MFR CONTRACTUALLY RESPONSIBLE FOR FURNISHING THIS ITEM TO THE GOVERNMENT", mark the CAGE code of the supplier that manufactured the part
- 2. Mark parts with "V" or "VEN" followed by the Supplier Site Code (found in PO Header)
- 3. If individual parts are too small to be marked using .12 high characters, group in quantities no greater than 25 parts per container and mark the container per 17.A.1-2 above

- B. If no marking is required by the drawing:
 - 1. Mark the part number per the PO line
 - 2. Mark "V" or "VEN" followed by the Supplier Site Code (found in PO Header)
 - Method optional, size optional
 - 4. If individual parts are too small to be marked using .12 high characters, group in quantities no greater than 25 parts per container and mark the container per 17.B.1-2 above

C. Parts delivered internal to a kit shall be identified as specified above and the kit shall contain a packing list which includes the kit part number and description, the component part numbers and descriptions, and the component quantities

17. BAE SYSTEMS MARKING REQUIREMENTS

As a minimum all parts submitted to BAE Systems shall be positively identified with the part number and supplier site number.

- This can be accomplished with stamps, etching, and the use of tags or bulk marking for smaller items (no more than 25 items per container). If a part is large enough to be marked using a minimum character height of .12, it shall be marked. MIL-STD-130 and drawings are for reference but may be used as a guide.
- The top level assembly, as identified on the purchase order, shall be marked. Sub-assemblies need not be marked unless the purchase order or drawing dictates marking or the sub-components are not attached to the major assembly.

Examples of identification: PART NUMBER: 12553820

SUPPLIER SITE NUMBER: V000124

A. **Part Number**: All parts shall be identified with the complete BAE Systems part number. The part number is shown directly under the **Item** block on the purchase order.

- All serialized items as required by the drawing or specification, hydraulic hoses, tubes, wiring harnesses, cables, wire assemblies, and buses <u>require</u> part marking per the drawing tabulation and/or specification in addition to the marking requirements of the Purchase Order and the PQR.
- B. **Supplier Site Number**: The assigned Supplier Site Number can be found on the first page of the purchase order under **Supplier Site**. The prefixes **V** or **VEN** shall be included in the marking to identify the number as the Supplier Site Number.
